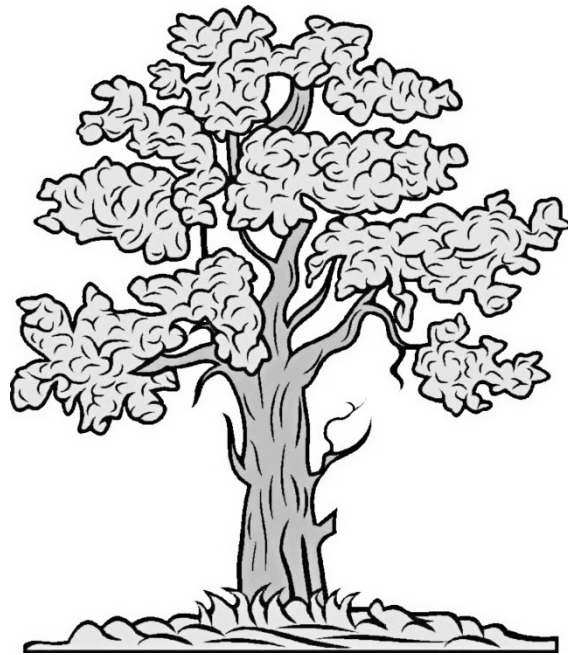

Notes on the Durham Family:

"For some unknown reason Harriet Higgins Durham, the mother of Alwyn Clare Durham, decided to make up a name for her first born - Koralton Sylvan Durham. Historically, most Durham first borns had been named William. William Mead Durham, William Lewis Durham. Koralton hated his name and so began being known commonly as KS. When he had children of his own, his firstborn was William C. and then his firstborn was also named William. When grandchildren began to come along William Lewis was deceased and Harriet had been known as Grandmother Durham to KS's and his brother Clare's children and so to avoid confusion KS and his wife Pauline, commonly known as Polly, became Grandpa KS and Grandma Polly to 9 grandchildren (and a few great-grandchildren).

Everyone should know somewhat of the history of their forefathers.
Written by Koralton Sylvan Durham

"THE DURHAM FAMILY is scattered all over England and Scotland as Earles, Dukes, Knights, etc. There is a county of Durham and a Durham Cathedral. in England. The forty used by General George Washington when he crossed the Delaware River at Christmas to capture Trenton were made at the Durham Forge; run by Robert Durham. The "Durham Boat" became the standard of transportation on the Delaware River for years. There were hundreds of these b ??

My Great-grandparents were William S. and Elizabeth Ann Durham, who lived on a farm at Bath, N. Y. In 1920 when camping on the old farm, we could see where the original "log cabin" had stood, but the frame house was in bad shape and the barn was falling down. Uncle Ezras wife Lucinda was still living i Bath. My Grand-father, William Meade Durham (called Meade) was born in 1841. He had two brothers and a sister who developed families; but since my father has been gone, we have lost contact with most of these people. Meade was a teacher at seventeen-then studied telegraphy and was employed opening Telegraph Offices in the many "boom Towns" of the Oil Discovery period. On July 4th 1867 he married Plenty Nellie Olds, at Meadville Pa. Three children were born to them--Willie at Pioneer Pa. Minnie at Fagundus Pa. and LeGrand at St. Joe Pa. in Butler County

In St. Joe Meade conducted a large general store and prospered. However this store was struck by lightning and burned. Very little was saved. In the early 1890s the family moved to Corry where Meade opened a Drug Store and established "Meads Modern Medicine Makers". This business grew and expanded until his death in 1902. At Meads death his son LeGrand; who had studied pharmacy was given management of the drug store.

My father; William Lewis Durham (Willie until after he was married) was born August 4, 1868 at Pioneer Pa. Today Pioneer is an open field. It was an Oil Boom town. The family moved to oil towns establishing telegraph offices and general stores, some of which burned. As a boy and young man Will helped his father in the sores. He attended several semesters (9 weeks each) at Grove City College and later took a course in book-keeping at Duffs Business College in Pittsburgh. After moving to Corry he worked in a store at Lakewood N. Y. ; then was employed as a book-keeper for the Climax Manufacturing Company in Corry. He was working there when I was born. At sometime he was a salesman for Dawsons Wholesale Grocery. On September 24, 1896 he was married to Harriet (Hatty) Higgins in Wrightsville (Warren County) and I was born April 6 1898, in the apartment over the drug store. At some date a little later Will purchased the Corry Plain-Dealer--a weekly paper. My earliest memory is of the print-shop in the basement room across the alley from the National Ban Soon Grandfather moved the

Drug Store into the brick building on the corner o Franklin Street and center; and dad moved the Print-shop the former Drug store building. There I spent my boyhood and learned something. We lived at 132 Mott Street in a house that was supposed to be finished new for me to be born in. About 1911-12 Will used up and borrowed all he could to keep the paper going; so he sold the house, closed the shop and went on the road a an independant salesman. Shortly he became associated with a company that ran voting contests for merchants, and gave away a Shetland Pony. The first World War spoiled that business. About earl 1917 he connected with theH&H Manufacturing Company, who made the Butter-Kist Corn Popper. He worked with that company for over seven years ; winning a number of nice prizes for the amount of business he turned in. He late worked again as a specialty salesman. He became ill and passed away in 1937 at the age of 69

Both Meade Durham and Will Durham were member of the Methodist Church and The Prohibition Party. The Corry Plai-Dealer promoted the Prohibition Party

The union of William L. Durham and Harriet Higgins produced three sons and one daughter.

1. Koraltan Sylvan Durham who married Pauline Ermel Durham
2. Alwyn Clare Durham who married Carrie Mack (oldest of seven girls and one boy)
3. Lyle Gelston Durman who married Dorothy Kime
4. Leona Myrle Durham who is now married to Harold Pomeroy

Koraltan ("K.S.") Durham attended the Hatch School for seven years, the Washington Street School for one year and was in the first class to go from the Eighth Grade into High School. He graduated from Corry High School in 1916 in the largest class up to that time.He worked that summer in the G. E. at Erie, helping make three inch and twelve inch shells for War contracts. He later worked for the Howard Tannung Company, then the Erie Railroad in several capacities in the freight and ticket handling departments. After the consolidation of the railroads he went to work at the Standard Turnbuckle Company; leaving them with the possibility of joining on e of the War services. He did not serve in the First World War because of some eye trouble. K. S. then acted as an independant salesman; and was associated for a couple of years with his father in the pop corn machine business. About 1921 he originated the store in the newly built Rex Theater; with a large Butter-Kist Corn Popper Peanut Roaster Combination; Laskaris Ice Cream and a fine line of candies. After developing a good business for a couple of years he sold this to another party.

For a short time K. S. worked for the Clark Lumber Company; then was called to be a store room clerk for the U. S. Radiator Company; a position he held until the spring of 1925. At that time the U. S. R. was employing over seven hundred men. In May K. S. was induced to thake up the sale of Singer Sewing Machines in Corry; then on June 5th 1925 he married Pauline Ermel Thayer from Youngsville at her brother's home in Millport, Pa. Rev. Laurence Thayer was the Minister. After three years with Singer in Corry, K. S. spent most of a year with Blubell Harsware in Weslyville; then he operated a Coffee and Specialty Route for the Grand Union Company. For a couple of years he was associated with the Singer Company in New York State; working in Lockport, niagra

Falls, Batavia Districts. With poor business and the "Depression" developing; and young Bill ready for school; K. S. brot the family back to Corry and they have been here since then. 1931

Durring the Depression K. S. helped on the W. P. A. Program in different capacities; laborer, engineer, time keeper on road work; over two years as supervisor of recreation in Corry--this included the ice rink and the start of work at Mead Park. During the Second World War K. S. worked for the B&H Trucking Company; running a freight route between Jamestown N. Y. and Corry and intermediate points. Later he operated a Coffee Route for the Great Amerocam Tea Company; for five years. When they closed down their business he worked with a Taxi Company in Corry for a short time; then was induce to purchase the Atlantic Gas Station Business at 626 East Main Street. After operating that business for about seven years he retired in 1964 at the age of sixty-six. Since retirement; a garage and a weavers cottage has been built on the property at 88 Railroad Street; some improvements made, and a large garden. Outside interests have been the church and the Corry area Historical Society. A hobby has been cooking peants for interested freinds.

The property at 88 Railroad Street was purchased in the fall of 1942. Many improvements have made over the years; and an extra small apartment was added.

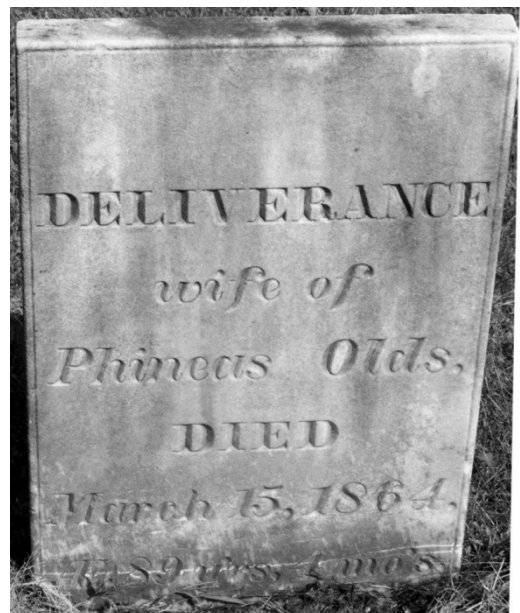

The HIGGINS Family is found in Rhode Island records at an early day. Owen Higgins was of Newport of that colony, married Seaborn Billings, a widow, daughter of Richard and Mary (Clarke) Tew. She was born June 4, 1640. Their son Richard married Elizabeth Hiscox and had four sons. From these sprang the Higgins family of Connecticut, prominent in town government and brave soldiers, many serving in the revolutionary army. From Connecticut the family spread to New Jersey, and later to western Pennsylvania, where the family herein recorded yet resides. (I) This record begins with Moses Higgins, born in Connecticut, where he followed farming, married and reared a family. His Children: Tilasse, Converse, Moses, Lindel, Harriet. With the children of Moses Higgins the history of the family in western Pennsylvania begins.

(II) Moses (2), son of Moses (1) Higgins, was born in Connecticut, 1815, he died in Crawford county, Pennsylvania, in 1890. He was a mason by trade and a farmer. 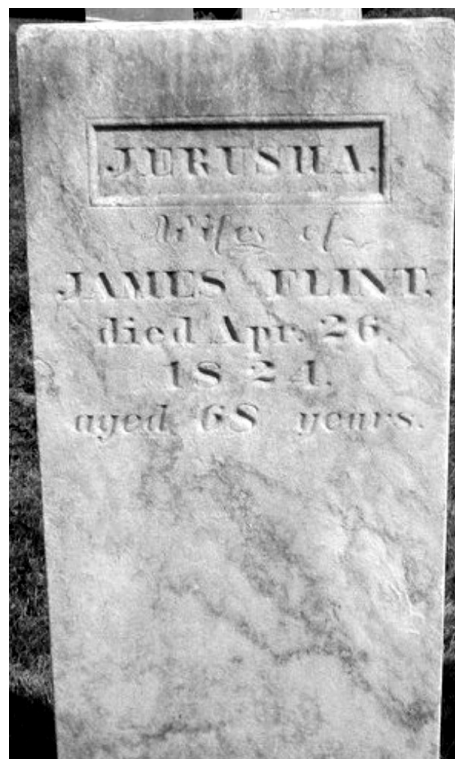

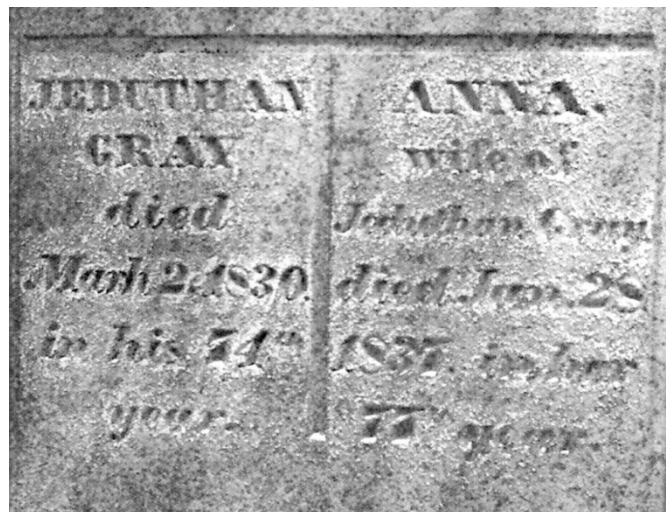

Jeduthan signed the Patriot Protest against British aggression at Amenia Precinct in 1775. In 1776, he enlisted in the Revolutionary Army in Capt. Wheeler's Co. in Col. Hopkin's sixth regiment of Dutchess County, New York, becoming a sergeant. He was honorably noticed for bravery at the battle near Fort Independence (near Peekskill, N.Y.) in 1777.

After the war, Jeduthan became prominent as an Elder and Baptist preacher, beginning his ministry at Seekonk, Massachusetts in 1785. About 1796, he removed to Egremont and in 1806, he moved on to Greene, Chenango County, New York and located on a farm owned by Philo Webb. In Greene, he began gathering together a church which



became the 2nd Baptist Church of Greene. In 1823, he moved to Concord, Erie County, Pennsylvania, bringing his grown up children with him and many others who soon followed him and the settlement they made was called "Grays". He continued his labors there as a pioneer preacher and was actively engaged until he died, 22 miles from home in Sugar Grove, Warren County, PA.

Anna Warren married Jeduthan Gray September 14, 1779 at Sharon, the ceremony performed by Rev. Cotton Mather Smith. The children that blessed their marriage were: Silas, Polly, Warren, Bethel, Hiram, Anne or Nancy, Sarah, Barnum, Joseph, Eli and Ameralzamon. The descendant of Richard Warren, who came to America on the "Mayflower", died January 28, 1837 in Concord Township, Erie County, Pennsylvania at the age of seventy seven and was laid to rest in the Concord Corners Cemetery near Spartansburg, Crawford County, PA. Between this date and May 30, 1748, he removed to the parish of Middle Haddam, on the east side of the Connecticut River, then in the town of Middletown, but later (by division of the town) in the town of Chatham. On the date last mentioned he bought of Philip Goff forty acres of land and a house in Middle Haddam. He appears to have been a farmer. His will, dated Feb. 23, 1768, mentions all the children here given except Nehemiah.
